On April 20, 2006, President George W. Bush proclaimed that May would be Jewish American Heritage Month to recognize over 350 years of Jewish history and contributions to American culture.

Jews (Jewish people) are both a religion and ethnicity.

- This is called an ethnoreligion, and means a group of people who share a common religion and ethnic background.
- "Religion" is an organized set of beliefs and practices that often connect to worshiping a god(s) or higher power.
- "Race" focuses on physical characteristics like skin color, hair texture, etc., but "ethnicity" is based on culture and where people live/come from.

There have been Jewish communities in the United States since colonial times. Early Jewish communities were primarily Sephardi, composed of immigrants from Brazil and merchants who settled in cities. Until the 1830s, the Jewish community of Charleston, South Carolina, was the largest in North America. In the late 1800s and the beginning of the 1900s, many Jewish immigrants arrived from Europe.

For example, many German Jews arrived in the middle of the 19th century, established clothing stores in towns across the country, formed Reform synagogues, and were active in banking in New York. Immigration of Eastern Yiddish-speaking Ashkenazi Jews, in 1880 to 1914, brought a new wave of Jewish immigration to New York City, including many who became active in socialism and labor movements, as well as Orthodox and Conservative Jews.



There are only 15 million Jews worldwide, which is only 0.2% of the entire population of the planet.

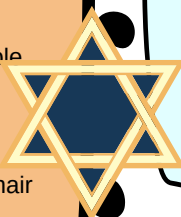

Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month (AAPI Heritage Month) is an annual celebration that recognizes the historical and cultural contributions of individuals and groups of Asian and Pacific Islander descent to the United States.

The effort to officially recognize Asian American and Pacific Islander contributions to the United States began in the late 1970s, and took over 10 years to make it a permanent month-long celebration. In 1990, Congress expanded the observance from a week to a month. May was annually designated as Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month in 1992 by President George HW Bush.

- Asians are the fastest growing student group in the United States, yet only 1% of school leaders identify as Asian.
- Asian, Asian American, and Pacific Islander history is largely left out of school textbooks and curriculum.
- There are many stereotypes about the Asian community, many of which uphold the "Model Minority Myth," which implies that Asian Americans have never faced discrimination or oppression, and ignores the diversity of our identities and experiences.
- Asia and the Pacific Islands are HUGE!!!
- When we talk about Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, the community is VERY diverse.
- According to the UN, there are 48 countries in the Asian continent, and 25 Pacific Island nations.
- There are hundreds of languages spoken, and different traditions and beliefs.
- There is no "ONE" Asian American or Pacific Islander history or identity or experience.
